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## THE JUNIOR LEAGUE OF HARTFORD MAKES BID FOR PEPSI REFRESH GRANT TO BENEFIT THE FRESHPLACE FOOD PANTRY

HARTFORD, CONNECTICUT (April 14, 2010) – Did you know that 40% of people who qualify for Food Stamps (SNAP) never apply for them. Why not? The application process is confusing, lengthy and requires a high school reading proficiency. The average literacy rate for an adult in Hartford is 4th grade and is not dissimilar to inner-city rates elsewhere.

The soon to be completed Freshplace Food Pantry will improve access to social programs (like SNAP) and educational services. In an effort to continue raising money to complete the construction and to stock the shelves of Freshplace, the Junior League of Hartford has submitted Freshplace to Pepsi's Refresh Grant Program. The Pepsi Refresh Project is an online grant program that makes available millions of dollars to be granted to projects, which are intended to improve communities through an online, democratic voting process. The more votes that your project gets, the greater your chances are of winning! During the month of April, Freshplace will be a featured project in the Food & Shelter category, seeking \$250,000 in funding to support operating costs for Freshplace.

Together, these collaborators have constructed a 2,000 square foot facility in Hartford's Upper Albany neighborhood that will provide: (1) fresh fruits, vegetables, meat and dairy products in addition to pantry staples; (2) client-choice based selections to accommodate the health, cultural, religious and familial needs of those who are hungry; (3) comprehensive intake and referral services to increase access to food stamps, health and crisis intervention programs, public assistance, and educational services; and (4) a community hub and resource, assisting in the revitalization of Upper Albany, supporting the network of existing area food pantries, and creating a center for community involvement.
